# Female Violence One—2—One Programme

Information for Offenders

## **FEMALE VIOLENCE ONE-2-ONE PROGRAMME**

The Female Violence One-2-One Programme as a 'Specified Activity' requirement as part of a Community Order or Suspended Sentence. It can also be used as a licence condition.

### **One-2-One Programme**

The Programme lasts for six sessions.

Each session should take approximately 1½ hours

You will be required to attend for every session as a National Standards Appointment.

You will be expected to engage in the module and to complete the necessary work that is required of you.

Should you fail to comply with the One-2-One Programme as part of the Specified Activity you will be returned to court.

### **Programme aim**

The aim of this programme is to help you better understand the reasons (issues) which led you to committing an act of violence. It will also work with you on a number of skills to assist you to avoid violence in future.

This programme is just the beginning. To avoid violent behaviour you will need to continue to think carefully and practice these skills.
